The tower has only penthouse-style homes, which are more than twice the size of the typical condominium, on every level. The result is a community of like-minded homeowners who have similar

investments, lifestyles and expectations for levels of service.

Amenities include two rooftop terraces with dual Viking barbecue kitchens, outdoor fireplaces and views of Elliott Bay from every home. The rooftop also boasts an indoor fireside lounge with a catering kitchen for private functions.

On the sixth floor, Fifteen Twenty-One Second Avenue offers a fitness center with aerobic equipment, free weights and a Pilates studio with sessions organized by the concierge.
